Bill Number: A/5692 (Gottfried)/ S.03690 (Hannon): Allows health care providers to engage in collective bargaining.

WE OPPOSE THIS MANDATE FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- This proposal subjects health insurance consumers to "price fixing" by their providers, further eroding the consumer's ability to effectively control health insurance costs. As small businesses are the hub of this state's economy, we must work to ensure continued access to basic, affordable health insurance.
- By reducing the competitive nature of healthcare, this bill ultimately increases costs. Studies estimate that for every 1% increase in premiums, 30,000 New Yorkers lose their health insurance coverage. (Barents Group 1999)
- It's counter productive to federal reform efforts. New York is at the threshold of enacting a federal exchange. The legislature must refrain from making any changes that will have a negative impact on the outcome of federal reform.
